The Louvre collection of drawings by Jean-Honoré Fragonard (17321806) is one of the finest available, and this petite catalogue provides an overview of his full career in 47 superb drawings. It reveals how Fragonard shifts from being the most scrupulous observer of nature, whether it be the human figure or landscape, to become the creator of moving religious compositions or of frivolously charming interiors, or again the boisterously unbridled illustrator of Ariosto or Cervantes. This book is part of a series exploring the vast collection of master drawings in the Louvreimages by great artists that reveal their draftsmanship and, often, the processes that led to the creation of some of their most renowned works. Reproduced in color plates, the drawings here are catalogued and described in detail, and the book includes an introduction and chronology. 82.
